WELCOME TO THE NEW BOARD MEMBERS:

Vice President for Americas: Debbie Low (CAN) – Debbie takes over the Vice President of the Americas position this year after already being an active participant in the ASPC. Since 2005, she has been the President and the CEO of the Canadian Sport Institute Ontario (CSIO). She also spent ten years with the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport's Multi-Sport Games Program and served as the Director of Sport for Toronto's 2008



Olympic Bid. She was Canada's Chef de Mission for the 2008 Paralympic Games and served as the Assistant Chef de Mission for the 2004 Paralympic Games.

Vice President for Europe: Tapio Korjus (FIN) – Tapio is in his first term as the Vice President for Europe position and looks to accomplish much in his term. Currently, he is the Director of the Kuortane High Performance Training Centre in Finland. Tapio is a 1988 Olympic champion in javelin. Tapio also served as the Director of Sports for Finnish Athletics and was a Member of National Elite Sport Development Programme by the Finnish Olympic Committee.

Vice President for Oceania: Alex Baumann (NZL) – Alex's recent move from Canada to New Zealand will benefit him in his first stint as the Vice President for Oceania. Alex, who currently serves as the CEO for High Performance Sport New Zealand, is one of Canada's most successful swimmers. Alex won gold medals in the 1984 Olympics in both the 200m and 400m individual medley races, breaking the world record in the process. Before moving to New Zealand in 2012, Alex served as the CEO of Own the Podium, a Canadian high performance sport programme.

MEET THE NEW EXECUTIVE BOARD AND RETURNING BOARD MEMBERS:

President: Dale Henwood (CAN) – Having recently served as the treasurer for the ASPC, Dale decided to take on the presidential position this year. Dale is the President and CEO of the Canadian Sport Institute Calgary in Canada and has been in this role since 1994.

Secretary General: Josep Escoda (ESP) – Josep has been a team member of the ASPC since it began in 1999 and is serving as secretary general for the second time. Josep is the CTO of Car Sant Cugat in Spain.

Treasurer: Tracy Lamb (USA) – Tracy is taking over the treasury position after serving a term as the vice-president of the Americas. He currently serves as the Director of the Chula Vista Olympic Training Center in the United States of America.

Vice President for Africa: Toby Sutcliffe (SAF) – Toby is serving a second term as the Vice President for Africa and has maintained his position as CEO of the HPC University of Pretoria in South Africa for eight years.

Vice President for Asia: Takashi Kawahara (JAP) – Takashi will tackle a second term as the Vice President for Asia, while continuing his position as the General Director of Research Departments for the Japan Institute of Sports Sciences.

The VIII Forum of the ASPC was held in Rio de Janeiro Brazil from 28 to 30 August and was a resounding success. There were a total of 127 delegates from around the world who attended the Forum. For the first time, the Association extended its hand of friendship, through the Brazilian Olympic Committee, to eleven countries from the region through the Olympic Solidarity Programme.

The Forum was officially opened by the Brazilian Olympic Committee President Mr. Carlos

Arthur Nuzman and the outgoing ASPC President Mr. Mike English. From the very first presentation by Mr. Bernardo Rezende, coach of the Brazilian Volleyball team who spoke on the topic of Leadership in Teams, the Forum delivered on its mandate of being

the best Forum ever hosted by the ASPC.



The presentations were structured to include a two hour lunch break where delegates from the various training centres and countries were able to interact and network on issues of common interest; accordingly, many new connections and friendships were established.

At the end of a very successful Forum, the General Assembly of the Association was held and new office bearers were elected. Mr. Dale Henwood of the Canadian Sport Institute in Calgary was introduced to the delegates as the new President of the Association for the next two years. Four new centres were welcomed and inducted as members of the Association while 14 centres received their five-year membership Bronze Plaques.

The next Forum of the Association will be held in Puerto Rico in 2015.
